- Judging commences at 9am sharp for ring classes, 10am for beginners and approx 12.30pm for jumping classes
- Competitors must enter the ring immediately when the class is called, wearing correct dress and back number provided, otherwise they will be disqualified.
- Unless otherwise stated, entry fee is \$4.00 per class and prize money is 1st \$5.00, 2nd \$3.00 and 3rd \$2.00. The committee reserves the right to alter, combine and or reduce prize money amount if classes are lacking in entries.
- All riders must wear protective headgear while mounted. Riders under 16yrs must wear protective headgear secured to the shell in more than 2 places.
- There is no ground levy but you have to pay your gate entry on the day. Please do not include this with your entry fee.
- Camping Fee is \$10.00 per site – please pay with entry, grazing will be provided not on grounds please contact Kelley Molloy 03 7533306 or email kjmolloy@kinect.co.nz for details
- Camping ticket and catalogue will be sent via email so please make sure you include an email address with entry and print these off and bring them with you.
- Entries close on the 19th February 2016 and will not be accepted unless accompanied by entry fee.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STOCK SECTION

1. Stock judging will commence at 9.30am sharp with the exception of Children's Pet which will commence at 9.30am
2. Cows in milk will be judged first
3. All dairy cattle must be haltered and broken to lead
4. Bulls over 12 months of age must be ringed and led by 2 people with ropes or poles
5. All Dairy cattle must be led out for Judge's inspection if required
6. All Dairy cattle will be judged on dairy points
7. All stock must be born on or after 1 June to qualify for various section
8. The Judge has the right to re-classify any stock entered in the wrong class
9. EXHIBITORS SHOW AT THEIR OWN RISK. The committee will not be held responsible, under any circumstances, for the loss, damage or miss-delivery of stock or implements exhibited at the show
10. Any person lodging a protest must deposit the sum of \$20, which will be forfeited if the protest is not allowed
11. The scale of points shall be: 1st - 5, 2nd - 3 and 3rd - 1
12. No stock shall be removed from the grounds until 3.30pm on the day of the Show.
13. No stock to be sold if not exhibited
14. Loading ramp situated in the grounds
15. All prize-winners must compete in Grand Parade or forfeit prize
16. In compliance with RAS, all cattle entries must be accompanied by a current TB Test Certificate. The cattle must have been tested within 60 days prior to the show.

17. Stock exhibitors south of Lake Mapourika need an exemption notice to move stock home from the show. The notices are attainable from the TB Free 0800 482 4636.

3 Year Old - 275 kg's of Solids

Plus one point for every 25kg's or part there of above the base rate, minus one point for every 25kg's or part there of below the base rate.

Type Rules:

- Each Judge to place them for type
- 1st place 50 points, 2nd place 48 points and so on
- Points to be added to production points
- In the event of a tie, cow with the highest m/s wins
